
Background:

Aston-Mansfield has been working in the heart of east London for over 130 years. Our work with children, young people and families offers hope and practical experiences to build aspirations and create better futures. Working with over 600 young people each year, our aim is to create a vibrant and inclusive learning environment so that young people can become successful and active citizens contributing to their communities.

We are proud of our work in developing and supporting young people from minoritised communities to build resilience and confidence, equipping them with the tools and skills to make positive life choices through our peer-led training and learning workshops. Our formula of formal and informal learning, together with interactive, fun and creative activities, meets different learning needs and provides a joyous and safe environment for young people to flourish. Our work with young people has achieved the London Youth Bronze Quality Mark award for 2022 to 2025.

We are seeking enthusiastic and dedicated young people aged 18-25 who possess excellent communication skills and a strong sense of initiative to support with the delivery of our Heritage Project "Old Stories, New Voices" as Young Facilitators. In this role you will ensure that we meet heritage principles, provide guidance on matters related to the interpretation, recreation and promotion of Aston Mansfield's rich cultural heritage, engage and encourage young people and the wider community to get involved.







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This role involves a combination of research, project management, community engagement and offers a unique opportunity to develop leadership skills, gain valuable experience in heritage management, and contribute to meaningful community projects. Primary Tasks:

- To support the development and delivery of Aston-Mansfield's heritage programme and act as a representative of Aston-Mansfield at appropriate forums and events and build relationships with relevant stakeholders.
- Promote, encourage and sustain youth participation of Aston-Mansfield's heritage programme by supporting cohorts of young participants.
- Co-design and co-deliver learning days, training days, socials and meetings to youth participants.
- Collect feedback from participants and report on the effectiveness of activities.
- Advise on heritage good practice of preservation, accessibility and marketing of Aston Mansfield's Heritage.
- To work closely with the Youth Team and support with the delivery of youth programmes.


